**NOVA's Response to COVID-19:
Findings from the Spring 2020 COVID-19 Student Survey**

During the Spring 2020 semester, Northern Virginia Community College (NOVA) responded quickly to the COVID-19 pandemic. During this time, NOVA began evaluating the short- and long-term effects the pandemic could have on student learning. To this end, NOVA partnered with the organization Ithaka S+R to conduct a survey regarding students' experiences and needs.

This Brief presents NOVA's results from the *COVID-19 Student Survey*, which was administered to students between April 21 and May 1, 2020. Of the 9,997 NOVA students who received a link to the survey, 559 (6 percent) completed the survey.

Key Findings

Effectiveness of NOVA Communications

- A majority of students indicated they knew where to find up-to-date information about NOVA's policies during the pandemic, suggesting NOVA has been effective in disseminating key information. However, over half of respondents indicated they would like to know more about academic advising resources and information the College is offering during the pandemic.

Impact on Student Learning

- During the transition to remote learning, students indicated they struggled the most with completing group assignments or presentations. Some students also found it difficult to access some course materials, such as technical reports and standards.
- Additionally, many students have found it difficult to manage their time, as well as balance family, household, and school responsibilities during the pandemic.

Impact on Health and Well-Being

- Students struggled to stay connected to other NOVA students during the transition to remote learning. However, many students still felt connected to their instructors during this time.
- More than half of students were concerned about their mental and/or physical health.
- More than half of students indicated they did not know where to find information about emergency resources, suggesting NOVA could improve communications regarding assistance options for students.

Impact on Enrollment and Graduation Plans

- Nearly two-thirds of respondents indicated they still planned to enroll in Fall 2020. Of those with no plans to reenroll, the majority indicated they planned to graduate or transfer.
- Many students were unsure of how the COVID-19 pandemic might alter their timeline and plans for graduation from NOVA.

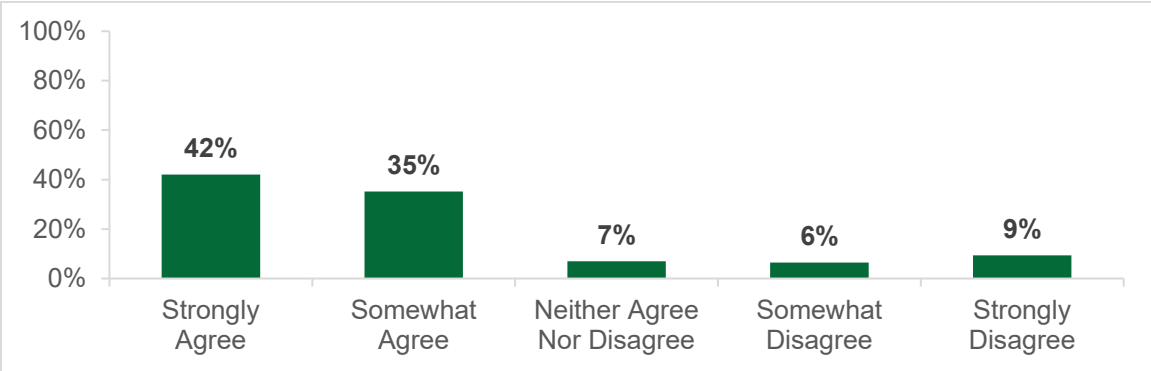
Part I. Effectiveness of NOVA Communications during COVID-19

This section presents results from survey questions asking students about the effectiveness of NOVA communications during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Finding Up-to-Date Information about NOVA’s Policies

A majority of students (77 percent) strongly or somewhat agreed that they know where to find the most up-to-date information about NOVA’s polices. This suggests that NOVA has been effective in disseminating key information to students.

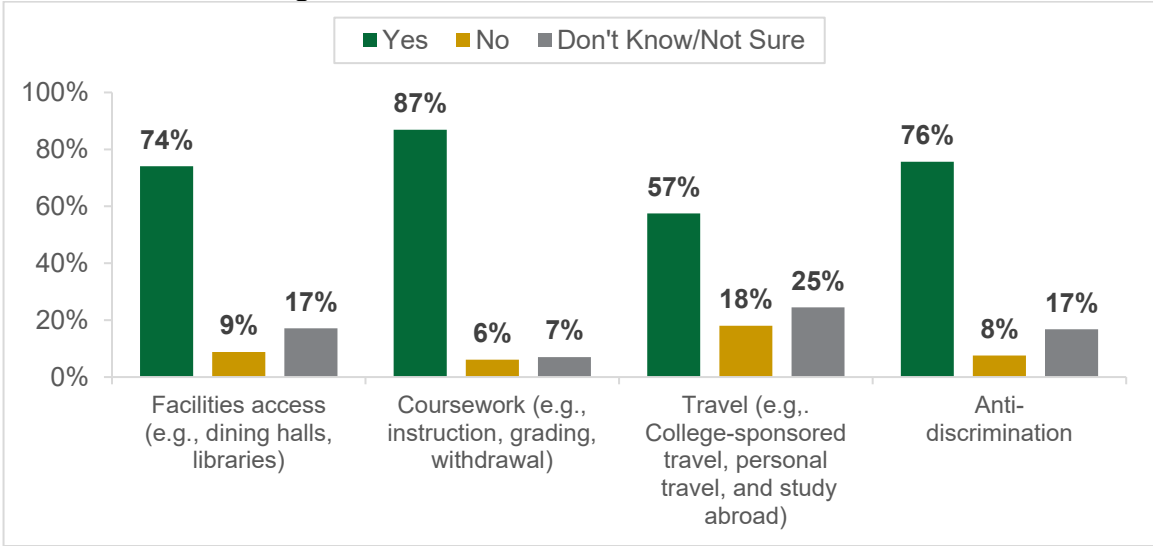


Understanding NOVA’s Policies

A majority of students indicated they understood each of the four policy areas listed below.

- The highest percentage of students indicated they understood NOVA’s policy on coursework (87 percent).
- The lowest percentage of students indicated they understood NOVA’s policy on travel, including College-sponsored travel, study abroad, and personal travel (57 percent).

Figure 2. I Understand NOVA’s Policies On...

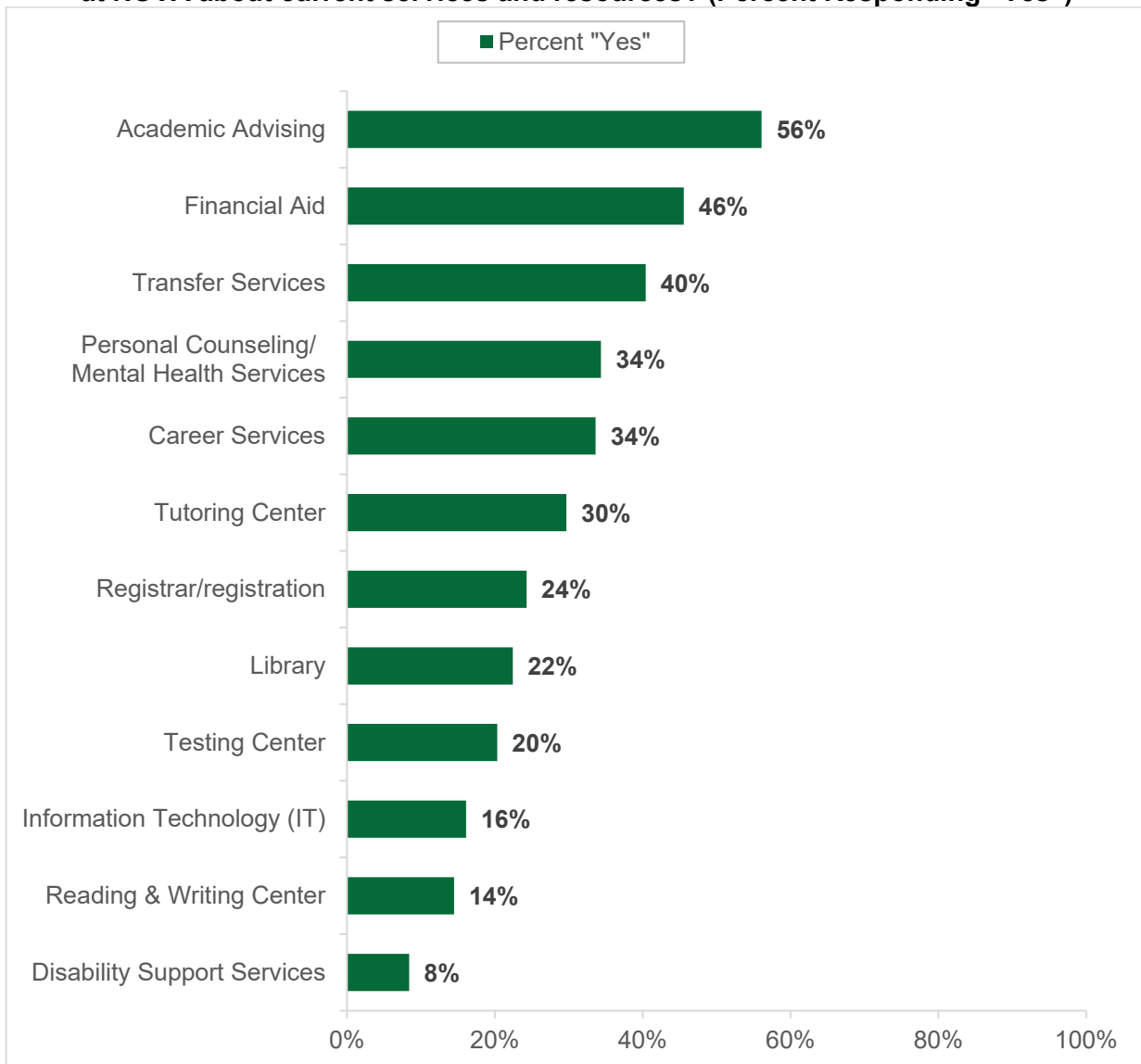


Information from NOVA Offices and Departments

The survey asked students whether they would like to hear more from select offices or departments at NOVA about current services and resources offered during COVID-19. Students were able to select more than one office or department.

- More than half of survey respondents (56 percent) indicated they would like to hear more from **academic advising** about current services and resources offered during COVID-19.
- Additionally, substantial percentages of respondents indicated they would like to hear more information about **financial aid** (46 percent), **transfer services** (40 percent), **counseling and mental health services** (34 percent), and **career services** (34 percent).

Part II. Impact on Student Learning

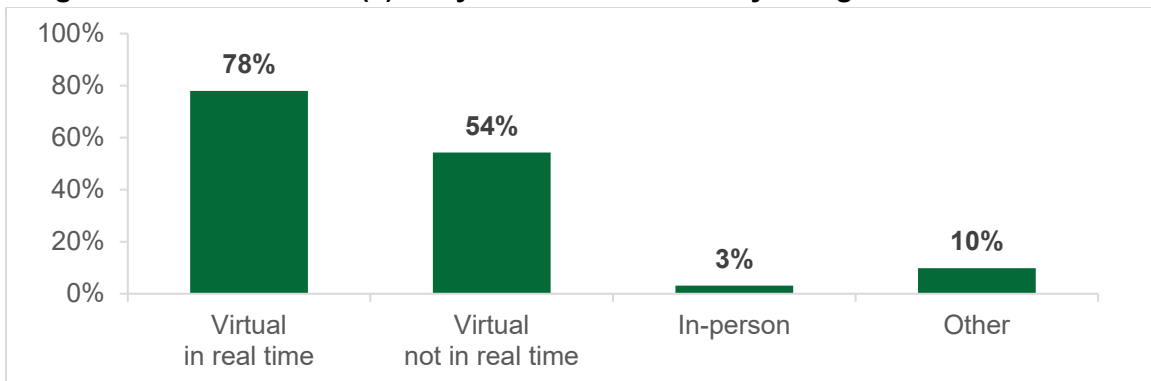
This section presents results from survey questions asking students about the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on their ability to learn and complete coursework during the current term.

Course Delivery During COVID-19

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, NOVA transitioned to remote learning in March 2020 for the remainder of the Spring 2020 term. For this survey question, students were asked to select the format in which their classes were currently being delivered. Students were able to select more than one format.

- During the COVID-19 pandemic, over three-fourths (78 percent) of respondents indicated they were enrolled in a course that was now being delivered online in real time.
- Additionally, more than half (54 percent) of respondents indicated they were enrolled in a course that was being delivered online, but not in real time (e.g., a recorded lecture).

Figure 4. In what format(s) are your classes currently being delivered at NOVA?

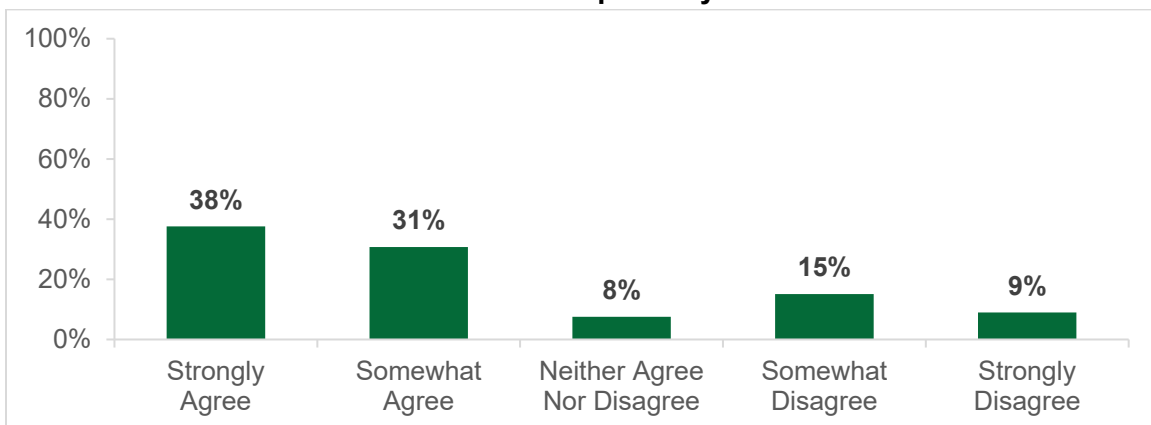

Ability to Complete Coursework

More than two-thirds (69 percent) of respondents indicated that they had the tools and resources they needed to complete their Spring 2020 coursework. However, nearly one-quarter of students (24 percent) indicated they did not have the tools they needed to effectively complete coursework.

Figure 5. Tell us the extent to which you agree or disagree. I currently have the tools and resources I need to complete my coursework this semester.

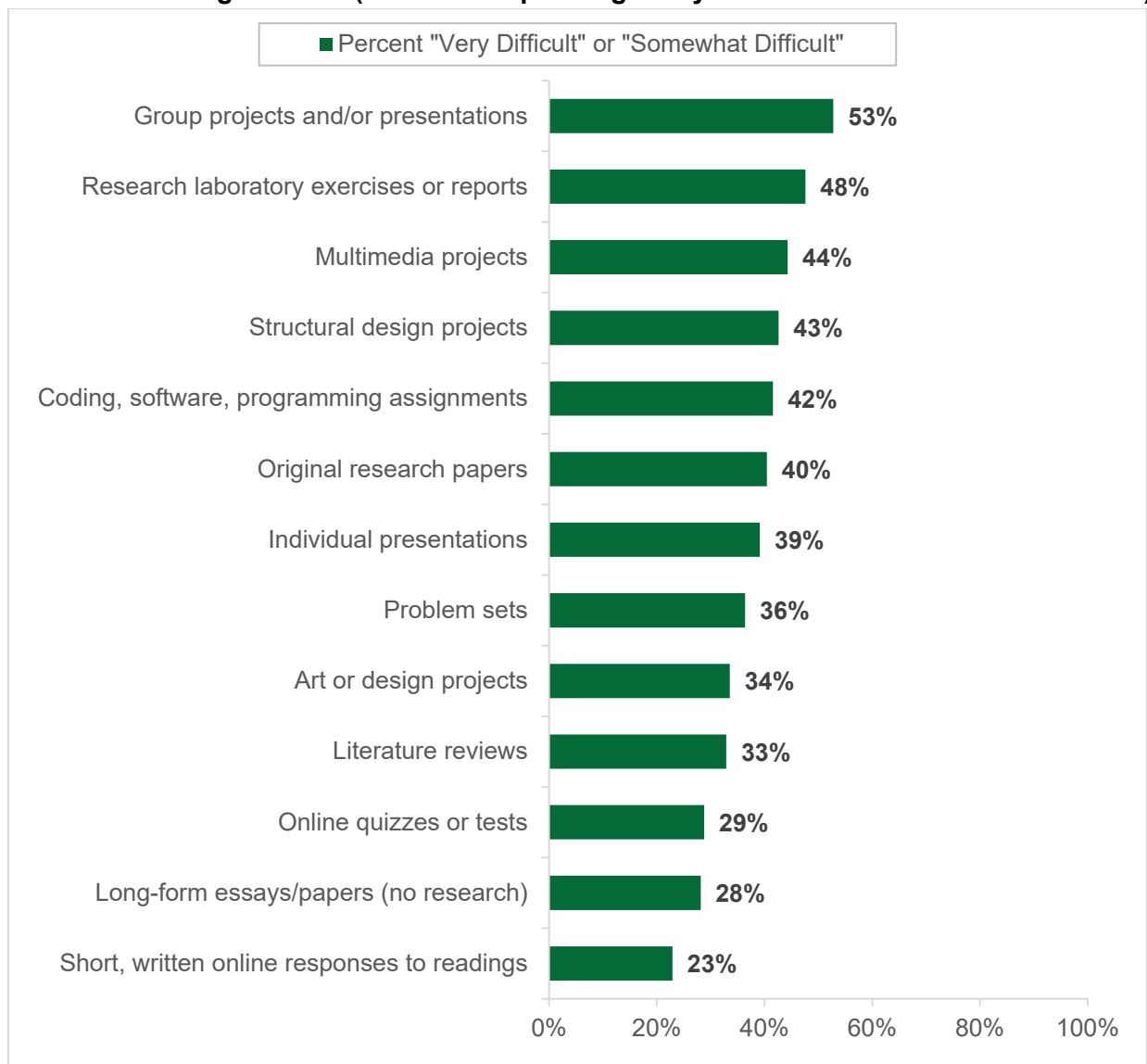


Ability to Perform Course Activities or Assignments

The survey asked students whether they found it difficult to complete select course activities or assignments after the transition to remote learning. Students who indicated an activity was not applicable to their courses were excluded from percentage calculations for that activity.

- More than half (53 percent) of respondents indicated they found it difficult to complete **group projects and/or presentations** during the COVID-19 pandemic. In fact, more respondents found this activity difficult than any other course activity or assignment.
- A substantial number of respondents also found it difficult to complete **research laboratory exercises or reports** (48 percent), **multimedia projects** (44 percent), **structural design projects** (43 percent), and **coding, software, and/or programming assignments** (42 percent).

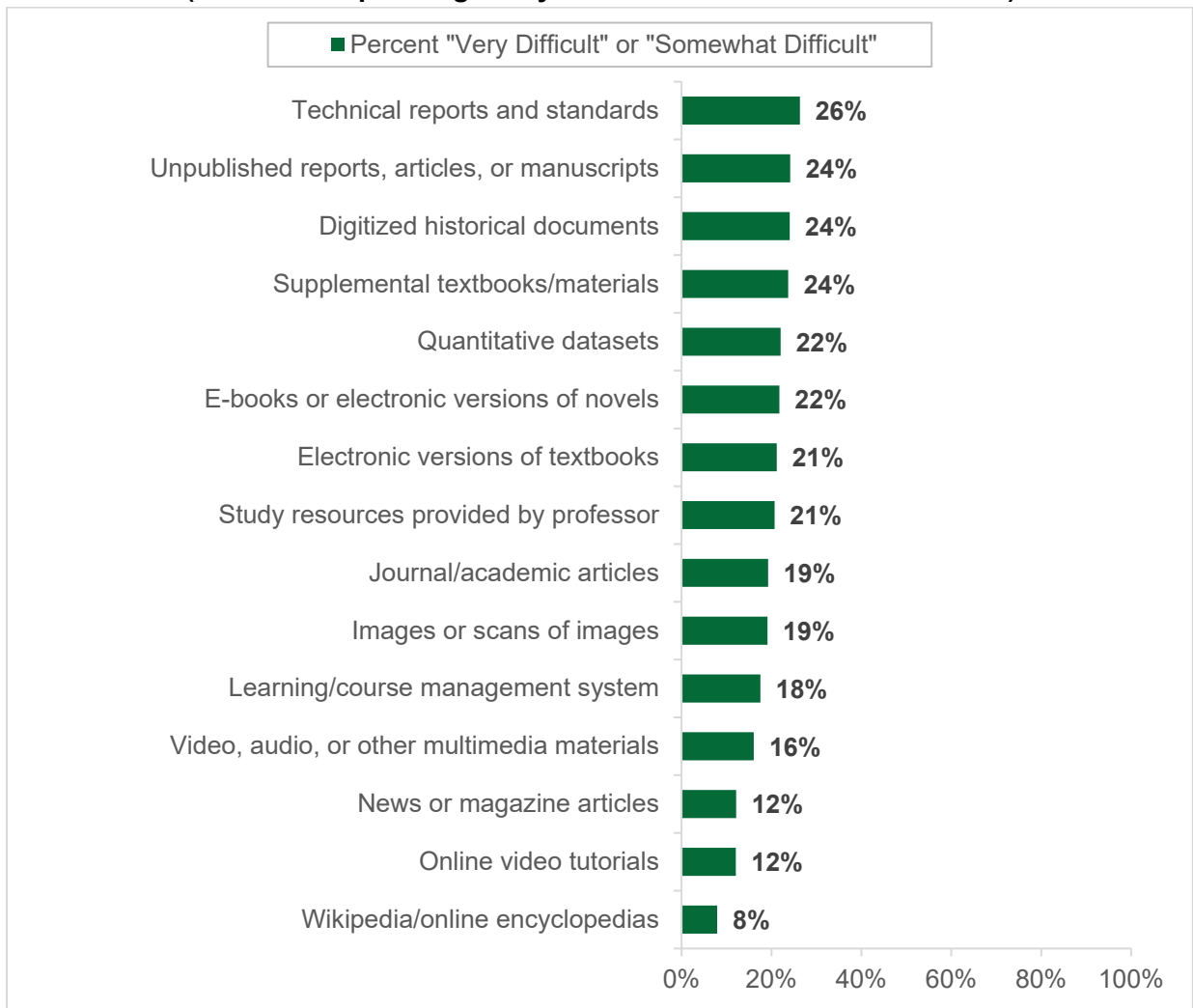

Ability to Use or Access Resources for Coursework

The survey asked students whether they found it difficult to use select resources to complete their coursework after the transition to remote learning. Students who indicated a resource was not applicable to their courses were excluded from percentage calculations for that resource.

- Overall, only 26 percent or fewer respondents found it difficult to access or use each of the below listed resources during the COVID-19 pandemic, suggesting NOVA faculty have been able to effectively deliver required course materials to students.
- The highest percentage of respondents found it difficult to access and use **technical reports and standards** to complete coursework during the COVID-19 pandemic (26 percent).
- Some respondents also found it difficult to access and use **unpublished reports, articles, or manuscripts** (24 percent), **digitized historical documents** (24 percent), and **supplemental textbooks and materials** (24 percent).

(Percent Responding “Very Difficult” or “Somewhat Difficult”)**



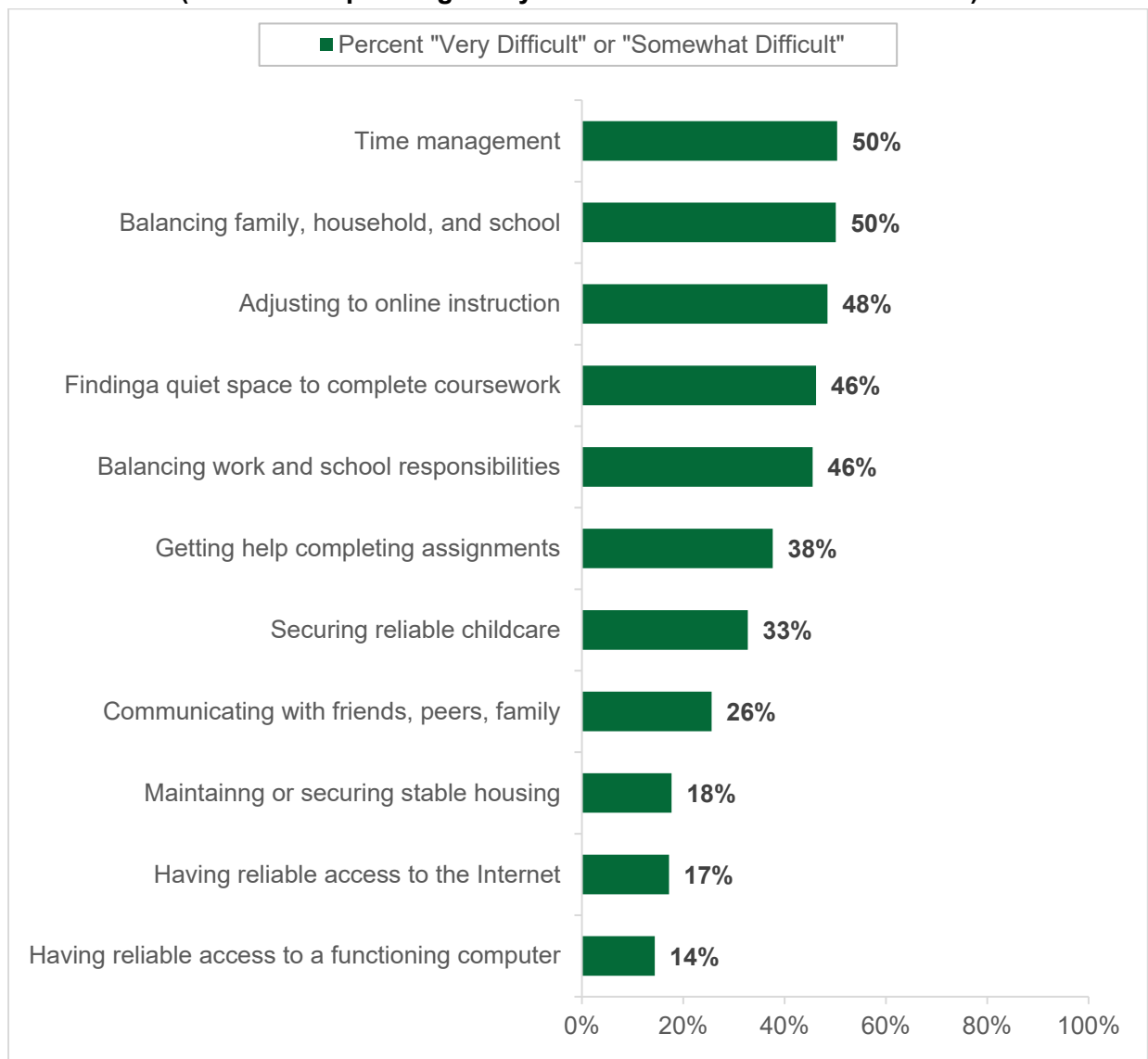

Ability to Complete Tasks and Balance Responsibilities

The survey asked students whether they found certain tasks and responsibilities to be difficult during the COVID-19 pandemic. Students who indicated an activity was not applicable to them were excluded from percentage calculations for that activity.

- Half of respondents found **time management**, as well as **balancing family, household, and school responsibilities** to be difficult during the COVID-19 pandemic. In fact, more respondents found these activities to be difficult than any other activity.
- A substantial number of respondents also found it difficult to **adjust to online instruction** (48 percent), **find a quiet space to complete their coursework** (46 percent), and/or **balance work and school responsibilities** (46 percent).

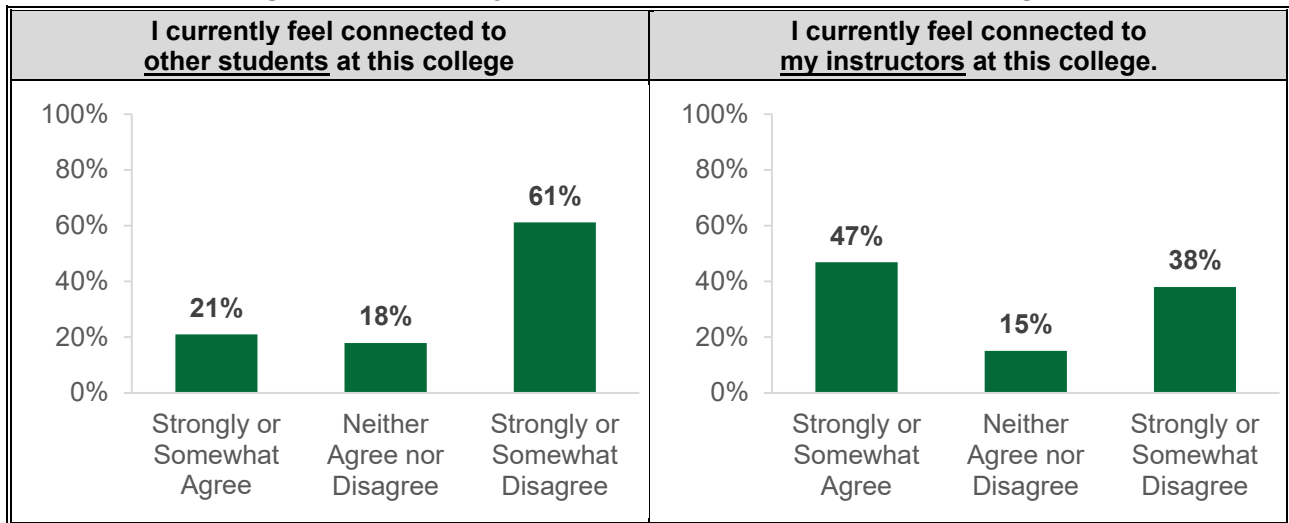
Part III. Impact on Health and Well-Being

This section presents results from survey questions asking students about the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on their health and well-being during the Spring 2020 term. Additional survey questions also ask about students' well-being in regards to food and housing insecurity.

Connection to Other Students and Instructors

- A majority of respondents (61 percent) indicated they do not feel connected to other NOVA students during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- However, almost half of respondents (47 percent) still feel connected to their instructors.

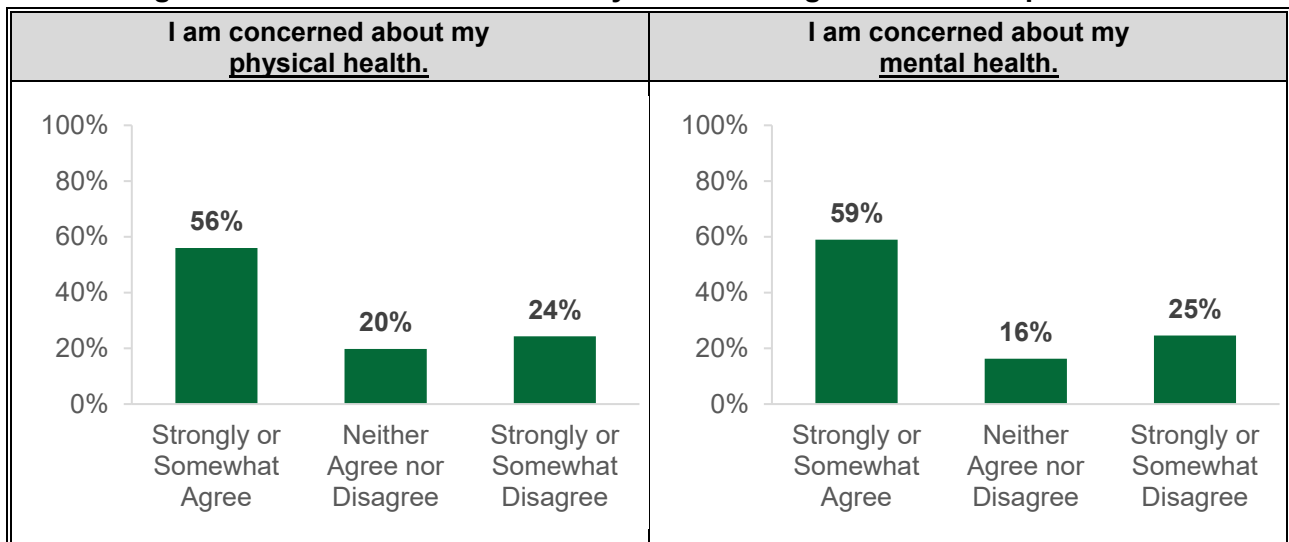
Figure 9. I currently feel connected to others at the college.



Physical and Mental Health Status

A majority of respondents are concerned about their physical health (56 percent), as well as their mental health (59 percent) during the COVID-19 pandemic.

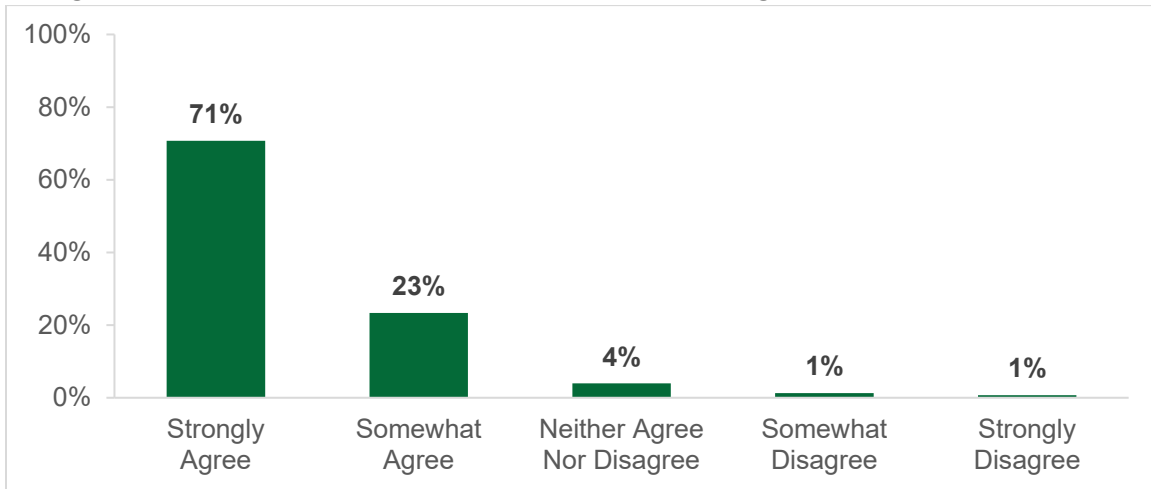
Figure 10. I am concerned about my health during the COVID-19 pandemic.



General Understanding of Pandemic Safety

Almost all respondents (94 percent) strongly or somewhat agreed that they know what they need to do to be safe during the COVID-19 pandemic.

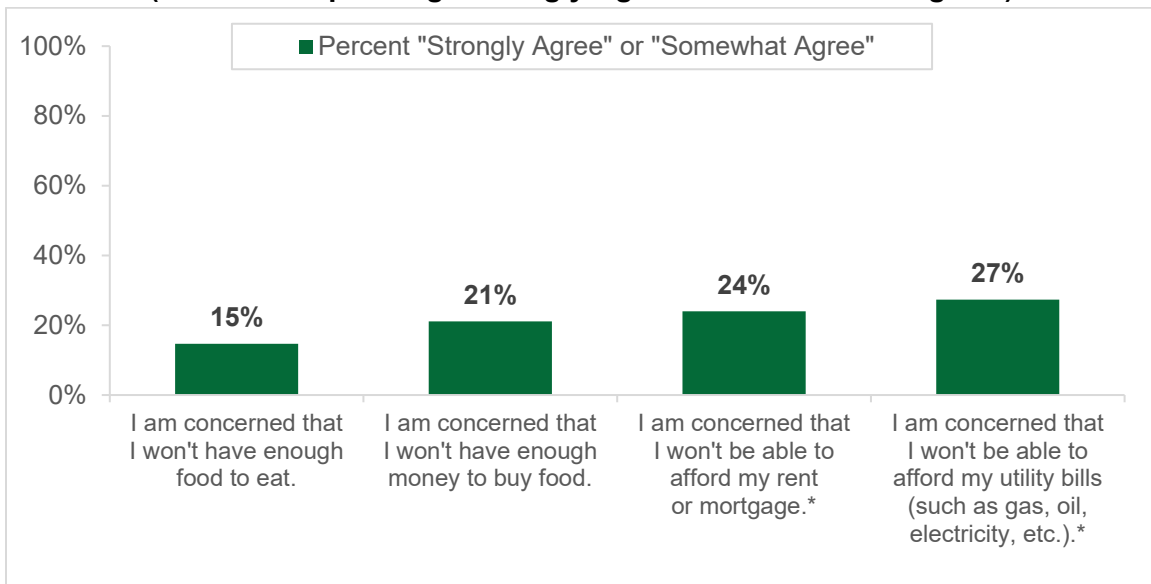
Figure 11. I know what I need to do to be safe during the COVID-19 pandemic.



Concerns about Food and Housing Insecurity

Some respondents indicated they have concerns about food and/or housing during the next 30 days. Approximately 15 percent are concerned about having enough to eat, 21 percent are concerned about paying for food, 24 percent are concerned about paying for rent or mortgage, and 27 percent are concerned about utility bills.

Figure 12. I am concerned about food and/or housing insecurity during the next 30 days. (Percent Responding “Strongly Agree” or “Somewhat Agree”)

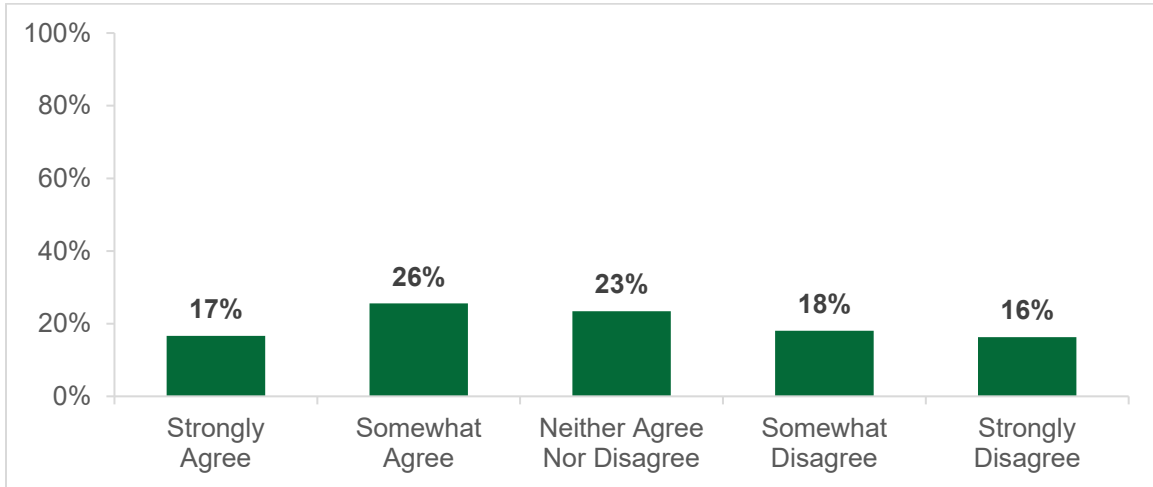

Information about Emergency Resources

Slightly less than half of respondents (43 percent) indicated they know where to find information on available emergency resources. This suggests NOVA could improve communications around emergency funding and loans, food pantries, or other options for students during the pandemic.

Figure 13. I currently know where to find information on available emergency resources (such as emergency funding/loans, food pantries, shelters, etc.).



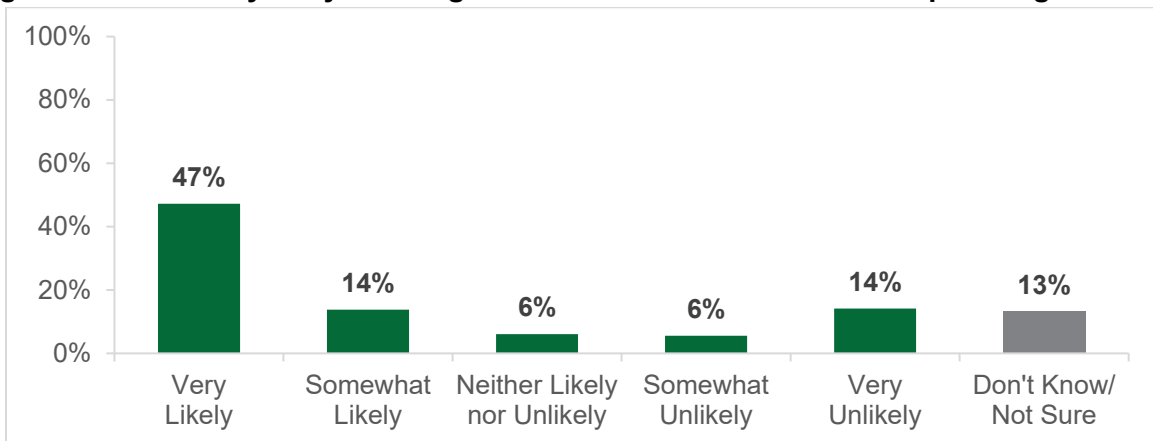
Part IV. Impact on Enrollment and Graduation Plans

This section presents results from survey questions asking students about their enrollment or graduation plans for the Fall 2020 semester.

Intent to Re-Enroll for Fall 2020

More than half of respondents (61 percent) indicated they were very or somewhat likely to reenroll at NOVA for the Fall 2020 semester. However, one-fifth of students indicated they were unlikely to enroll, and 13 percent were unsure of their enrollment plans.

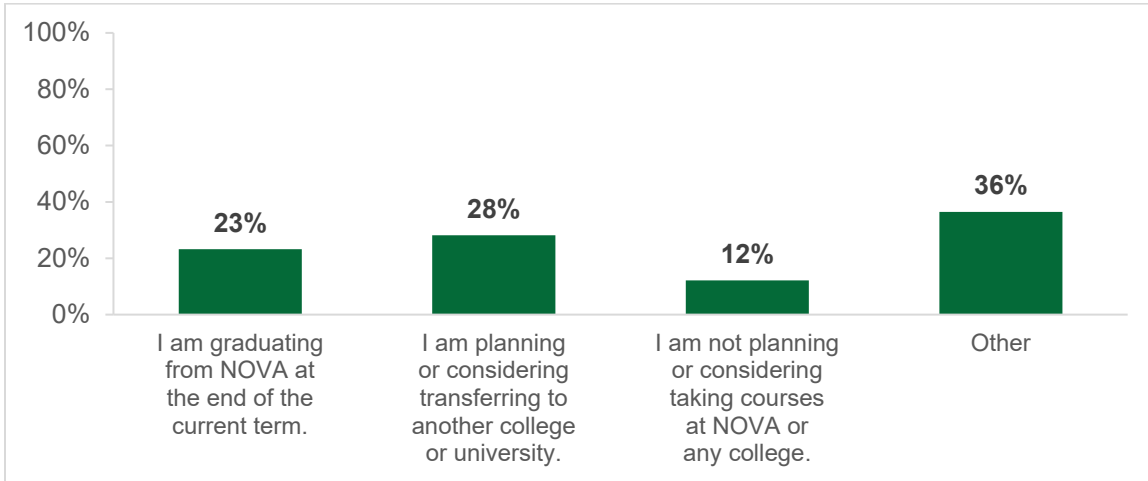
Figure 14. How likely are you to register for classes at NOVA in the upcoming fall term?



Reasons for Not Re-Enrolling in Fall 2020

- Of students who indicated they were not likely to reenroll or were unsure of their enrollment plans, approximately half (51 percent) said they intended to graduate or transfer after the current term.
- However, 12 percent of these students indicated they were not planning to enroll at NOVA or any other college in Fall 2020.

Figure 15. Please select the statement below that best describes why you are unlikely to or not sure if you will register for classes at NOVA in the upcoming fall semester or term.

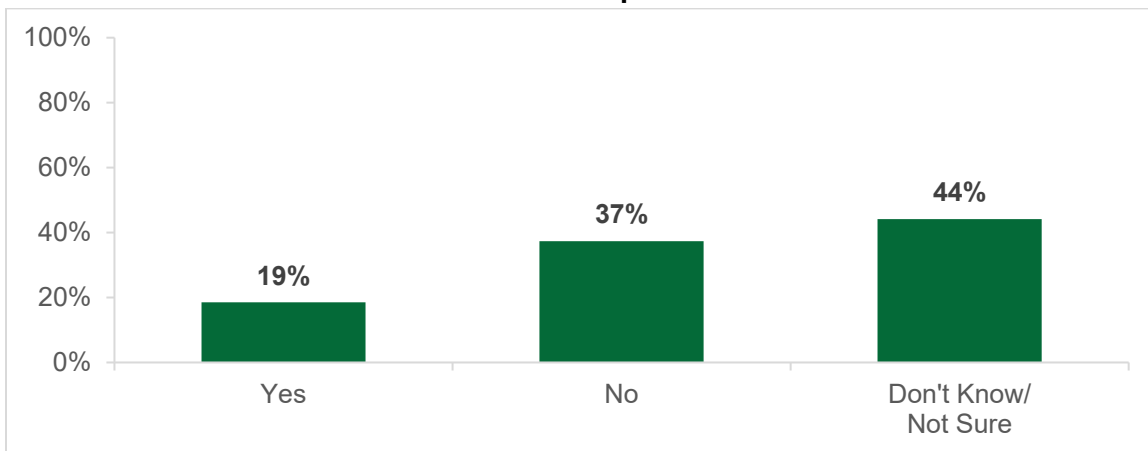

Graduation Plans

Of students who said they were likely to reenroll at NOVA in Fall 2020, a substantial number (44 percent) were unsure of the impact the COVID-19 pandemic will have on their graduation plans. However, 37 percent indicated they do not believe the pandemic will impact their intended timeframe for graduation from NOVA.

Part V. Discussion and Conclusion

Respondents' answers to the *COVID-19 Student Survey* indicate that most NOVA students know where to go to find up-to-date information about the College's policies during the pandemic, and students generally have a good understanding of these policies. This suggests that NOVA has been effective in disseminating key information to students during this difficult time. However, NOVA could improve communications in two ways: first, many students do not know where to go to find information about emergency assistance options. Therefore, NOVA could disseminate more information to students about emergency financial assistance and loans, food pantries, or other assistance programs. Second, many students suggested they would like more information about academic advising services and resources the College is offering during the pandemic.

In terms of student learning, most students felt they had the tools and resources they needed to complete their coursework. However, students found it difficult to complete some course activities remotely, such as group assignments and presentations. Additionally, students indicated that the pandemic has made it difficult for them to manage their time, as well as balance their many competing responsibilities effectively (such as home, work, family, and academic responsibilities). NOVA faculty and staff can improve on their ability to assist students with time management and course-specific tasks, including helping students understand better how to transition to remote learning. Such an effort may contribute to their success during this difficult time.

Additionally, the survey results underscore the importance of an attention to students' general wellness during this time. Survey responses suggest that students are finding it difficult to feel connected to other NOVA students. However, many still feel connected to instructors, suggesting faculty have been successful in their ability to maintain connections with their students. Another challenge for students is that a majority are concerned about their physical and/or mental health during the pandemic. Therefore, it is likely students are encountering many new challenges to their well-being during the pandemic that they otherwise would not have faced, and these challenges could affect their ability to be successful in their courses. Helping students to understand and navigate these challenges may be key to their success at NOVA.
