2014 High School Graduates from Outside NOVA's Service Area Who Applied to NOVA and Registered: Fall 2014

This Research Note pertains only to high school graduates from high schools outside of NOVA's service area (e.g., foreign high schools, private high schools, home schools, high schools outside Northern Virginia, or GED recipients). The number of 2014 high school graduates from outside the service area who applied to NOVA for Fall 2014 is compared to the number of these students who registered at NOVA during Fall 2014.¹ Data are shown by home campus (the campus at which the student indicates on the application as the one where he/she plans to attend).

- As seen in Table 1, the Loudoun and Woodbridge Campuses had the greatest percentage of recent graduates who registered at NOVA out of the total number of applicants from outside the service area (51 and 49 percent, respectively).
- College-wide, 39 percent of applicants who recently graduated high school outside of the NOVA service area registered for classes at NOVA in Fall 2014.

¹ These students graduated from high schools outside NOVA's service area or received a GED from July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014 and registered at NOVA for the Fall 2014 semester.

² Applicants who indicated Medical Education Campus as their home campus or for whom home campus information was not available (323 applicants) are not represented in the data.

³ The 'Applied to NOVA for Fall 2014' column shows the number of recent high school graduates from high schools outside of NOVA's service area who indicated on their application that they intended to begin their studies at NOVA in Fall 2014.
