# Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE) 2017: Benchmark Comparisons by Academic Program

#### Introduction

#### What is CCSSE?

- Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE) is an annual nationwide survey of community college students.
- > CCSSE helps institutions gauge their performance in areas of student engagement.
- > NOVA participates in CCSSE every 2-3 years and has done so for over a decade.

#### What are CCSSE benchmarks?

- CCSSE identifies five benchmarks for assessing institutional performance in student engagement based on groups of conceptually-related items on the survey:
  - Active and Collaborative Learning
  - Student Effort
  - o Academic Challenge
  - Student-Faculty Interaction
  - Support for Learners

## **CCSSE 2017 at NOVA**

At NOVA, **1,694 students** participated in the CCSSE in Spring 2017.

## **NOVA Academic Programs**

> This Research Brief details NOVA's scores on the five CCSSE benchmarks by academic program classifications.


## **Key Findings**

- Student engagement was greatest among NOVA students in Mathematics, Psychology, Science Technologies, Law and Legal Studies, and Allied Health Professions, Sciences programs, all of which had scores above national averages on three out of five benchmarks (e.g., Active and Collaborative Learning, Academic Challenge, and Student-Faculty Interaction benchmarks).
- Student engagement tended to be *lowest* among NOVA students in **Physical Sciences**, Visual and Performing Arts, Communications, Education, and Protective Services programs, all of which had scores below national averages on all five benchmarks.

## **Benchmark 1. Active and Collaborative Learning**

At NOVA, *six* academic program classifications scored above the national average for the *Active* and *Collaborative Learning* benchmark. Scores for this benchmark were *highest* among NOVA students who indicated they were enrolled in **Law and Legal Studies** programs and *lowest* among student who indicated that they were enrolled in **Communications** programs (60.7 versus 37.9). (Figure 1)


Figure 1. CCSSE 2017 NOVA Benchmark Scores by Academic Program:

#### **Benchmark 2. Student Effort**

Seven academic program classifications scored above the national average for the Student Effort benchmark at NOVA. Scores for this benchmark were *highest* among NOVA students who indicated that they were enrolled in **Psychology** programs and *lowest* among students who indicated that they were enrolled in **Protective Services** programs (53.2 versus 39.3). (Figure 2)

Student Effort




## **Benchmark 3. Academic Challenge**

At NOVA, *nine* academic program classifications scored above the national average for the *Academic Challenge* benchmark. Scores for this benchmark were *highest* among NOVA students who indicated that they were enrolled in **Science Technologies** programs and *lowest* among student who indicated that they were enrolled in **Protective Services** programs (60.0 versus 38.2). (Figure 3)

Figure 3. CCSSE 2017 NOVA Benchmark Scores by Academic Program:



## **Benchmark 4. Student-Faculty Interaction**

Six academic program classifications scored above the national average for the Student-Faculty Interaction benchmark at NOVA. Scores for this benchmark were highest among NOVA students who indicated that they were enrolled in **Mathematics** programs and *lowest* among students who indicated that they were enrolled in **Communications** programs (60.3 versus 41.9). (Figure 4)


Figure 4. CCSSE 2017 NOVA Benchmark Scores by Academic Program: Student-Faculty Interaction



#### **Benchmark 5. Support for Learners**

Overall, NOVA scores were *lowest* for the *Support for Learners* benchmark when compared to the national average (46.6 versus 50.0, see *Table A1*). Thus, only *two* academic program classifications scored above the national average for the *Support for Learners* benchmark. Scores for this benchmark were *highest* among NOVA students who indicated that they were enrolled in **Science Technologies** programs and *lowest* among students who indicated that they were enrolled in **Communications** programs (51.7 versus 33.8). (Figure 5)
